8.28.010 Prohibited--Exceptions.

No person, firm or corporation shall burn any trash, papers, rubbish, garbage, refuse, construction debris or building materials anywhere within the village of Ladd, Bureau County, Illinois. However, leaves and other landscape waste only, and only if generated from vegetation on the premises where being burned or any contiguous lot owned by the same owner(s), may be burned between the hours of eight a.m. and six p.m., Monday through Saturday, inclusive. Additionally, leaves and other landscape waste only, and only if generated from vegetation on the premises where being burned or any contiguous lot owned by the same owner(s), may be burned on Sundays between the hours of eight a.m. and six p.m., but only from September 15th through November 15th of each year, inclusive. The burning of leaves and other landscape waste at any other time is hereby prohibited. The open burning of leaves and other landscape waste shall be permitted on public rights-of-way, except on sidewalks, roadways, alleys, parking lots or other paved areas. No burning shall be permitted within twenty feet of any structure. All fires shall be constantly attended by a competent person until each fire is extinguished. The fire chief shall have authority to prohibit burning when atmospheric conditions, other conditions or the location of the fire in his or her opinion constitute a hazard. Open campfires of clean, nonconstruction timber and kindling are hereby exempted from the prohibitions of this section.

8.28.020 Violation--Penalty.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this chapter shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than five hundred dollars for each offense, and any day, or part thereof, during which a violation of this chapter is deemed to have occurred shall be considered a
